**SUBJECT: Changes in Submission Process of Emissions-Related Defect and Recall
Reports under 40 CFR Part 85, Subparts S and T**

Dear Manufacturer:

The purpose of this letter is to advise Highway Motorcycle manufacturers of changes in the submission process for emissions-related defect and recall reports, including quarterly reports submitted to EPA. These changes will harmonize the collection of emission related defect reports and recall reports for all industries that submit under the requirements of 40 CFR Part 85, Subparts S and T.

Currently, Highway Motorcycle manufacturers are submitting this information to EPA in many formats and via several distribution methods which creates an undue burden on the EPA and manufacturers to collect, maintain and report out on this information. As EPA continues to streamline all certification and compliance reporting processes, we are taking several steps to help address these issues.

EPA is making available reporting forms for immediate use by Highway Motorcycle manufacturers. These forms can be found on our website at:

These are the same forms that are currently being used for light-duty vehicles and heavy-duty engines under the above provisions. Forms are available for the following reports: Emissions Defect Information Report Form, Voluntary Emissions Recall Report Form, and Quarterly Report Form. There are no changes in the forms or submission process for current users of these templates.
